Drafting a News Bite

News Bites are information sharing summaries about an upcoming event / initiative / published paper / new research / and relevant and important news. They're a condensed article and should run at 300 - 400 words.

Crafting the News Bite:

- The goal of the News Bite is to tell the reader what they need to know in a clear, concise way.
- The News Bite should answer the 5Ws and H (**w**ho, **w**hat, **w**here, **w**hen, **w**hy and **h**ow). This is a basic formula journalists use to gather information.
- Keep it brief, punchy, clear, and simple. Try to simplify language and use lay-speak. Opt for a full-stop over a comma where possible.
- Header / headline: 8 12 words should do
- Intro paragraph: 2 3 sentences
- Body: 250 400 words. Include at least one quote / direct speech from a relevant subject.
- Conclusion: Link it back to the header / intro para. Include a link to the published paper if applicable.

- Images should be at least 1MB in size and captioned appropriately (max 25 words detailing context about the pic).
- Alternatively, you can source generic image options related to the work / event, suitable to run along with the copy.
